CHRISTIAN STEWARDS

22ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME USELESS WORSHIP

Dear Fellow Disciples, peace.

As we return to meditating on the Gospel according to Mark, we are confronted with Jesus' critique of the exterior acts of devotion and worship performed by his contemporaries. Acts without depth or conversion of heart and life.

Jesus follows the example of the prophets of Israel, who denounced the peoples' faith and devotion which were based only in exterior actions but empty of interior meaning and conversion. We also risk such empty faith and devotion.

Exterior actions in discipleship must be the result of an interior transformation and conversion. Otherwise, we will be lip worshipers only, not worshipers in spirit and truth.

As disciples committed to daily conversion we use the exterior actions of devotion, reverence and worship to express our faith and transformation in Christ Jesus. We want to tell the world that He is the center and the motor of our lives and that His Church is our home, with all her richness of Truth, Tradition and Teaching. After our five weeks reflecting the mystery of the Real Presence in the Discourse of the Bread of Life (Jo 6), now we must be ready to witness our love and reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist celebrated, adored and received in Holy Communion. In fact, the ways we celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and receive Holy Communion which are prescribed by the Church, the way we conduct Holy Hour before some of our Holy daily Masses and the day of Adoration on Thursdays are all exterior expressions of our personal and communal growth in discipleship.

May the Holy Spirit guide us in our personal and communal daily conversion towards Christ and through Him, may our eyes and hearts be open to see and love more our neighbor, whomever he or she may be.

SAINT ROSE COLUMBARIUM UPDATE:

The Columbarium Exploratory Committee is excited to announce the addition of several new parishioners. The current members of the Committee are: Chairman Tom Fix, Dr. Bill Smith, Sam Bates, Lori Heil, Mary Howell, Minerva Salazar-Lopez and Raguel Gaskins. Their dedication and countless hours of time are greatly appreciated.

Does the Catholic Church allow the mixing of cremains? NO. The cremains of each individual Catholic must be interred in their own urn. Our Saint Rose niches will be deigned to hold up to 2 urns each.

Does the Catholic Church allow the scattering of cremains? NO. Scattering of ashes on the sea or a lake, from the air, over the ground or being kept at the home of a relative or friend is not the reverent disposition the Catholic Church requires per the Order of Christian Funerals, Appendix II.

How must cremains be interred? The Catholic Church requires that all cremains must be interred either in a grave buried in consecrated ground or in a columbarium built on consecrated ground like our Saint Rose Columbarium would be.

May cremains that have been kept at home or elsewhere be moved to our columbarium? YES. Parishioners are encouraged to please utilize the new Saint Rose Columbarium to inter loved ones in a permanent consecrated Catholic Church approved Eternal Home.

Can there be a Funeral Mass and Committal Service? YES. Traditional services may continue as usual in the Church and include a Committal Service at the columbarium.

¿La Iglesia Católica permite la mezcla de cenizas? NO. Las cenizas de cada católico individual deben ser enterradas en su propia urna. Nuestros nichos de Santa Rosa estarán diseñados para albergar hasta 2 urnas cada uno.

¿La Iglesia Católica permite la dispersión de cenizas? NO. La dispersión de cenizas en el mar o un lago, desde el aire, sobre el suelo o manteniéndolas en la casa de un familiar o amigo no es la disposición reverente que requiere la Iglesia Católica según el Orden de Funerales Cristianos, Apéndice II.

¿Cómo deben enterrarse las cenizas? La Iglesia Católica exige que todas las cenizas se entierren en una tumba enterrada en suelo consagrado o en un columbario construido sobre suelo consagrado, como sería nuestro Columbario de Santa Rosa.

¿Se pueden trasladar a nuestro columbario las cenizas que se han guardado en casa o en otro lugar? SÍ. Se anima a los feligreses a utilizar el nuevo Columbario de Santa Rosa para enterrar a sus seres queridos en un Hogar Eterno permanente, consagrado y aprobado por la Iglesia Católica.

¿Puede haber una Misa de funeral y un Servicio de entierro? SÍ. Los servicios tradicionales pueden continuar como de costumbre en la Iglesia e incluir un Servicio de entierro en el columbario.

THE WOODLAND SANCTUARY

We are truly blessed, here at Saint Rose of Lima!

As we explore more and more of the Beasley property, the Lord continues to reveal the endless beauty it contains - sharing His gifts of rare/uncommon birds, protected species and native plants. It is so important to respect this ecosystem and become knowledgeable of our surroundings.

This past weekend a Red-eyed Vireo (rare) and a White-eyed Vireo (uncommon) were spotted in the Woodland Sanctuary. They might have been migrating; regardless, we are so fortunate to have such a diverse ecosystem. It is a testament to the resilience and balance of our natural world.

Also living in the sanctuary is a Tennessee native orchid, Spiranthes cernua – commonly known as Nodding Lady's Tresses.



All of these creatures offer a multitude of benefits, from ensuring health and food security to supporting economic stability and community well-being.

If you are interested in visiting this natural habitat, please call the office first. It's crucial to approach with respect and mindfulness. These environments are home to diverse ecosystems that are often sensitive to human interference. Disturbing these areas can have unintended consequences on the wildlife and plant. It's also important to remember that taking anything

from these habitats—be it rocks, plants, or artifacts—can be detrimental to the preservation of the area's natural and cultural heritage. By observing without interfering, we allow future generations to enjoy and learn from these spaces just as we have.

EL SANTUARIO DEL BOSQUE

¡Somos verdaderamente bendecidos aquí en Santa Rosa de Lima!

A medida que exploramos más y más la propiedad de Beasley, el Señor continúa revelando la infinita belleza que contiene, compartiendo Sus dones de aves raras y poco comunes, especies en protegida y plantas nativas. Es muy importante respetar este ecosistema y conocer nuestro entorno.

El fin de semana pasado en la propiedad Beasley llamado Woodland Sanctuary (Santuario Woodland) se pudo observar unos pájaros llamados Vireo, muy raro y poco común con ojos rojos y el otro de ojos blanco. Podrían haber estado migrando; De todos modos, somos muy afortunados de tener un ecosistema tan diverso. Es un testimonio de la resiliencia y el equilibrio de nuestro mundo natural.

También vive en el santuario una orquídea nativa de Tennessee, Spiranthes cernua, comúnmente conocida como Nodding Lady's Tresses.

Todas estas criaturas ofrecen multitud de beneficios, desde garantizar la salud y la seguridad alimentaria hasta apoyar la estabilidad económica y el bienestar de la comunidad.

Si está interesado en visitar este hábitat natural, llame primero a la oficina. Es fundamental abordarlo con respeto y atención. Estos entornos albergan diversos ecosistemas que a menudo son sensibles a la interferencia humana. Perturbar estas áreas puede tener consecuencias no deseadas para la vida silvestre y las plantas. También es importante recordar que tomar cualquier cosa de estos hábitats (ya sean rocas, plantas o artefactos) puede ser perjudicial para la preservación del patrimonio natural y cultural del área. Al observar sin interferir, permitimos que las generaciones futuras disfruten y aprendan de estos espacios tal como lo hemos hecho nosotros.


