

33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

WE DON'T KNOW THE TIME. WHY WORRY?

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, our Readings bring us face-to-face with themes of finality and judgment. Jesus speaks about the end of time, reminding us that everything we see--the heavens and earth--will one day pass away. However, His message is not one of fear but of hope and readiness. In the Gospel, Jesus says, "heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away". In a world where everything is constantly changing, God's Word is our foundation for "Christ's cross stays firm while the world moves" (motto of the Cartusian order, founded by Saint Bruno in 1084). His promise of love and salvation will stand forever. Jesus assures us that, even in times of uncertainty and hard-ships, He is with us and will fulfill His promises.

As His disciples, we are called to live with a sense of readiness and trust. Jesus doesn't ask us to live in fear of the end but to live in the present with love and purpose. Our faith gives us hope, not just for today but for eternity. We are invited to stay close to God through prayer, the sacraments, and acts of love towards others. In other words, to follow Jesus in an intentional discipleship. In that way, the day and time when God's will intervene in our history will not catch us by surprise for as His disciples we'll be always ready.

May the Holy Spirit prepare us with hope and love for that day whenever it will come.

NO SABEMOS LA HORA. ¿POR QUÉ PREOCUPARSE?

Queridos Discípulos, paz.

A medida que nos acercamos al final del año litúrgico, nuestras Lecturas nos enfrentan cara a cara con temas de finalidad y juicio. Jesús habla del fin de los tiempos y nos recuerda que todo lo que vemos (los cielos y la tierra) algún día pasará. Sin embargo, su mensaje no es de miedo sino de esperanza y disposición.

En el Evangelio, Jesús dice: "El cielo y la tierra pasarán, pero mis palabras no pasarán". En un mundo donde todo cambia constantemente, la Palabra de Dios es nuestro fundamento para "La cruz de Cristo se mantiene firme mientras el mundo se mueve" (lema de la orden Cartuja, fundada por San Bruno en 1084). Que el Espíritu Santo nos prepare con esperanza y amor para ese día cuando llegue. Dios los bendiga




Good Shepherds of Bethlehem



Capital Campaign Development Projects:

Here's a brief update on each:

Marian Center -

Review sessions were held with the ONE Building Committee and other stakeholders. The architects will now begin the Contract Documents Phase. After we secure city approval, we will begin requesting bids for construction in early February. Construction could begin by summer.

McGivney Center (formerly the Stonewall House) -

We are awaiting approval of the Site Plan. Once we receive this we'll proceed with the final design and bidding. Phase 1 focuses on constructing ten parking spots.

Athletic Fields Relocation (New Gym Preparation) -

A more intensive study significantly reduced the identified wetland areas on the property. We have submitted the report to TDEC and the Corps of Engineers. With their approval, we'll have much more flexibility in the layout of the athletic fields.
