
COMPLINE FOR SUNDAY NIGHT

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. – Amen.



A: For you has he commanded his an-géls, * to keep you in áll your wáys.


C: They shall bear you upon their hánds * lest you strike your foot á-gainst á stóne.


READING Revelation 22:4-5


